



Picasso Tour at the Met and Dinner at Solera

Our next event is a private guided tour of the highly acclaimed Picasso show at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. The Met is exhibiting its complete holdings of Picasso's paintings, drawings, sculpture and ceramics, plus 200 works on paper for the first time ever. The show represents every period of Picasso's career from his self-portrait "Yo," made when he was 19, to "Standing Nude and Seated Musketeer," made when he was 87. Many of Picasso's works on paper at this exhibit have rarely, if ever, been shown at the museum. The show will be exhibited for a very limited period of time.

After the show, we will continue with our Spanish theme. A private bus will take us to the Spanish restaurant Solera for a delicious dinner of garlic shrimp, chorizo, patatas bravas, jamon recebo, calamares fritos, pescado del dia and corte carnicero a la parrilla in a chimichurri sauce. Our dinner will be accompanied by wonderful Spanish wines and manzanilla sherry. We will conclude with four delicious desserts including an outstanding dark chocolate dessert.
